

## Frequently Asked Questions:

**Q:** What kinds of grease are recyclable?

**A:** Animal fats, cooking oil, and cooking grease are recyclable. It is best to filter out debris from your grease while pouring it in the container. It is also important **not to mix any water** with the grease you intend to recycle. Motor oil and industrial or petroleum-based grease must be recycled separately at local hazardous waste recycling centers.

**Q:** Why should the grease be cool prior to pouring it in the container?

**A:** If you pour hot grease into a plastic container, the plastic may melt and contaminate the grease, or worse, spill, burn you, and make a mess!

**Q:** What containers can I use to collect grease?

**A:** Old milk jugs, jars, coffee cans, or other plastic containers screw-on with lids. Wax coated and styrofoam containers should not be used. A lid is important to keep out water and to keep the grease from spilling.

**Q:** Why does the grease storage container need to be dry?

**A:** Water will also contaminate the grease and make it more difficult to use for biodiesel production.

**Q:** What does biodiesel have to do with me?

**A:** We all breathe the same air. Diesel emissions account for a significant amount of particulate matter and harmful pollutants in our air. Biodiesel is a cleaner burning fuel that helps preserve air quality and public health. Biodiesel is also a more sustainable resource than petroleum diesel.

**Q:** How do I start recycling my waste cooking oil?

**A:** Visit one of our Neighborhood Greecycle Centers and donate your grease!
